Holy Communion

Lutheran Christians believe that in the Sacrament of the Altar we receive the true body and blood of Jesus, for the forgiveness of our sins. We also believe that communing at our altar is a confession that one believes what our church believes, teaches and confesses.

If you are a visitor, we ask that you please speak to the Pastor first. If you are not a member of a Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod congregation, we cannot admit you to Holy Communion. We encourage you to express in your heart a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

Individual cups are served on the left side and the Common Cup is served on the right.

Coloring Bags are available in the narthex for young children during the church service. Please return all items and bags to the stand after the service.

Attendance Pads have been placed in all the pews. We encourage you to complete it before worship or while offering is being collected. PLEASE WRITE/PRINT LEGIBLY! These pages are the basis of tracking attendance and communion participation at Our Redeemer. Thank you!

THE SERMON “Priests Worship the High Priest”

Hebrews 13:7-16

⁷ Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. ⁹ Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings, for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited those devoted to them. ¹⁰ We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. ¹¹ For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy places by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. ¹² So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. ¹³ Therefore let us go to him outside the camp and bear the reproach he endured. ¹⁴ For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come. ¹⁵ Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. ¹⁶ Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.
